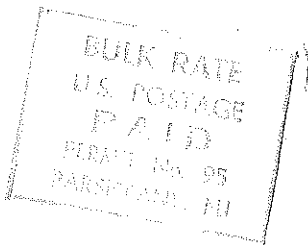
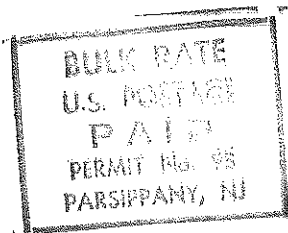


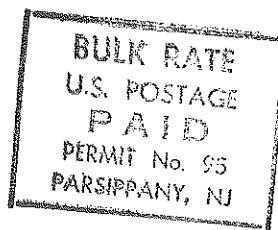

published in due course of time.


I also appeal to all the Konkani in North America to coincide

The Old Students and Friends of the Canara Schools are aware that the Governing Body of the C.H.S. Association had fulfilled their long-cherished desire with the opening of the Canara Junior College and the Canara College in 1972 and 1973 respectively. It is a matter of gratification that during the last few years, the two Colleges have made their mark in the three areas of Arts, Science and Commerce in respect of both high pass-percentages and ranks, year after year.

The original blue-print had provided for an Academy Hall cum Auditorium common to the two Colleges, and the Governing Body is of the view that this provision can no longer be delayed. Plans have been drawn up, and the building licence has been obtained from the Corporation of Mangalore. The Auditorium, with a plinth area of 6400 square feet, an upper balcony 44' X 26', and a verandah on three sides, is estimated to cost about Rs 6.25 lakhs and another Rs. 2 lakhs for furniture and equipment.

Our Old Students would be aware that in the Canara High School we have the Shri Bhuvanendra Hall and the Shri Sukriteendra Smarak Kala Mandir. It has been our ardent desire that the proposed Auditorium should be associated with the holy name of Srimad Varadendra Thirtha Swamiar; and we approached Srimad Sudhindra Thirtha Swamiar, Sri Kashi Mutt Samsthan, for permission. We are very happy to announce that His Holiness has graciously granted us the permission to name it as "Shri Varadendra Auditorium", and blessed our efforts.

The Governing Body requests the generous "Khabbar" readers, especially the old students and the friends of our institutions who have always stood by us in the past, to donate generously towards the construction of the Auditorium, so that the activities of the two Colleges could be conducted fully, and the present handicap suffered by them removed. It is our earnest hope that this appeal would meet with a generous response from all.

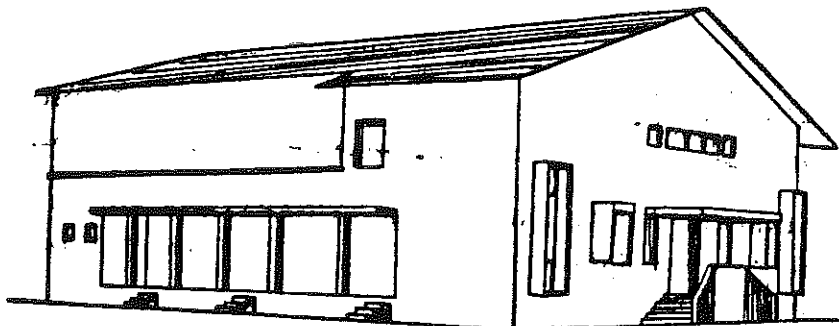
