Bhagavad-Gita as a Stress Management Guide - Cont.

Chapter Nine:

An interview with a Karma Yogi

"I touch your feet with my head, Mahatmaji!" I said with awe as Gandhiji came on the intercom. Gandhiji replied, "Namasthe, Kamathji! I am honored!" His voice rang clear as a bell. I sensed both compassion and firmness. "I have set aside exactly twenty minutes for you," said Gandhiji. "What would you like to know?"

'Looking at his watch again!' I thought to myself. "Mahatmaji, many wise men have told me that you were the greatest *Karma Yogi* - a person attached to Pure Action- who ever lived. I have learned from the reading of your life history that you applied teachings of *Gita* in all aspects of your life and work. Please tell me what is *Karma*?"

"Well, *Karma* means Action. An Act done with no selfish desire (4:19) for or attachment to its fruits (2:51), without regards to success or failure (4:22), and which dedicated to God (5:10) is Pure Action or *Nishkama Karma*. Such Acts bring joy to the one who practices them and debits from his *Karma* Account (3:31). Impure Acts, also known as *Kamyas Karma*, are those acts which have selfish motives (3:36). Such Acts bring on stress to people, and add to their *Karma* Account (5:12). In other words, all selfish Acts have long term consequences. Pure Action ultimately leads to Peace, Tranquility and Self-realization."

Gandhiji continued, "The teachings of *Gita* were the foundation on which my entire life's work (Acts) rested. *Gita* was the inspiration for my decision to give up all material comforts (2:55); it was *Gita* that gave me the needed courage to give up fear (2:40), anger and greed in my heart (2:56). It was *Gita* that gave me the strength to destroy my inner, cultivated weaknesses so that my hidden, God-given strengths could find expression in my Actions, which I invested in the service of my countrymen. I became Action-oriented as a result of my Knowledge (*Jnana*) of *Gita*. It was from *Gita* that I learned that without selfless service to humanity a life is not worth living. *Gita* taught me the art of Pure Action, *Nishkama Karma* (2:47), which is Action without any expectation of returns (3:19,20). It was *Gita* that taught me how to control my Senses, how to regulate my life, how to moderate my habits, etc."

Having read about Gandhi, I knew all this was true enough. "I am wondering, Mahatmaji, how an ordinary person like me can apply *Karma Yoga* in managing stress in my everyday life." I asked. Gandhiji replied without any hesitation, "We are often tempted to indulge in Activities which are driven by our selfish Desires. Such Actions invariably lead to stress. We want to raise our standard of living (make more money) at the expense of quality of our life (no time for family, spiritual activities) (2: 44) to the detriment of our soul and welfare of others. Selfish Acts not only hurt others but damage us as well (3:36-41). We experience disappointments, anger, hate, resentments, etc., all toxic to our brain. For what? All for things we think we want but really do not need in the first place. At the end of the day how much do we need to make a decent living? We can eat only three meals a day; we need only one bed to sleep on; can wear only one pairs of clothes at a time. Everybody seems to be in a blind race to selfishly enrich themselves without realizing the long-term consequences of their Acts on themselves, their family and others.

"Instead, if we indulge in Activities without expectations of any fruits, we have nothing to feel disappointed about, nor would we be adding points to our *Karma* Account (2:51). Nor would we be indulging in greed and fraud. We must learn to see God in every person, and when we serve them we would feel as though we are serving God. When a person does his work with such attitude of detachment, he begins to experience peace and tranquility in his mind. That means no stress." (I was reminded of the saying: *Janatha seveye Janardana seve.*)

"Mahatmaji, I can understand giving up greed in my Actions. However, if I have no right for the fruits of my Action, how can I make a living?" Gandhiji had a good laugh at this. He said, "Renunciation means giving up selfish acts. You are well entitled to make a decent living by means of your profession as long as you are absolutely honest in your dealings and your Actions are pure. This is your just reward. Anything beyond that is a no, no. If a friend of yours asks you to water his indoor plants during his vacation, help him out without worrying about when you could ask him a favor in return. Keep doing good things to others without keeping an account of such deeds, and don't expect to cash in on those old favors. This attitude will free you from stress."

"Mahatmaji, I have read that Truth (*Satya*) and Non-violence (*Ahimsa*) were the two pillars on which your life's struggle rested. What is the role of *Ahimsa* in our life? How is it related to *Karma Yoga*?" I asked curiously. Gandhiji replied, "*Himsa* is an Act of selfish Desire perpetrated against others with the motive of getting something from them. *Ahimsa* is a refrain from such "violent" Action. When we renounce selfish Desire and fruits of all Action, we are, in effect practicing *Ahimsa*. In this "Inaction" of not doing selfish Action, we are Acting (4:18) in the spirit of *Ahimsa*. *Ahimsa* also means we avoid attacking people we disagree with, for we should never forget that they, too, have the image of God in them. Our Actions should not violate that Essence in them."

“Mahatmaji, *Gita* mentions the importance of doing one’s *Dharma* (duty) even if it means killing one’s relatives and friends. How is this consistent with the doctrine of *Ahimsa*?”

“I do not believe that *Gita* advocates wonton violence. However, I think violence in the performance of one’s *Dharma* might be justified to protect the innocent from the life-threatening Action of evil people. I believe that Lord Krishna urged Arjuna to kill Kauravas only because He believed that not killing them would cause a greater tragedy: the death of many innocent and good people. Even here, He urged Arjuna to wage the war in the spirit of Pure Action, which is without hatred or fear; without regards to victory or defeat; success or failure and in the spirit of his *Dharma*. He also urged Arjuna to dedicate this Action to Him. This would assure that no taint of sin would touch Arjuna. And Arjuna would be free from the stress of his Action, no matter how horrible. It would have been a greater sin to walk away from this righteous war (2:31-33). Even Lord Krishna took births as *Avatar* from time to time to protect the good and destroy the evil (4:7).”

At this point I remembered the story of the movie *Mother India*, in which a mother finally kills her own son after he turned into a brigand who terrorized a community by evil acts.

“Mahatmaji, what is the role of Truth in all this?”

“To me, the search for God, Soul, Self, Atman, Brahman, etc. means nothing but the search for the Truth. Each of us has a set of beliefs, which we consider to be the Truth. All spiritual roads ultimately lead to Truth. We call this God. I see God in every Pure Action in the path to that Truth. What if someone else’s Truth conflicts with my idea of Truth? My Truth said that the British rule of India was inherently evil. The British’s Truth said just the opposite. During India’s independence struggle, I was willing to sacrifice everything, including my own life, in the defense of my Truth, and I called this struggle *Satyagraha*, Truth Force, insisting on Truth. *Satyagraha* was a case of 100% Pure Action.”

“Mahatmaji, *Gita* seems to be so difficult to understand and practice. You have any words of wisdom for us?”

“Kamathji, it is true that *Gita* appears to be so complicated. If you read it a few times, you would be amazed how simple and easy it is to understand. Most of it is tedious repetition! Same message is said in a hundred different ways. Everything in this world is complicated until you understand it. Then it is just a piece of cake... oops! goat’s milk cheese cake. Did you not think in the beginning of your training that the human mind was so complicated? Now you seem to think it is so simple. The same is true of *Gita*. *Gita* simply says, selfish desire for and attachment to sense objects, and excessive attachments to fruits of Actions lead to greed, fraud, lying, cheating, violence, deceit, etc. which in turn create stress in our daily life. If we can raise our awareness about these in every one of our Actions, reduce our daily needs and wants, and make a conscious attempt to change for the better by giving up hate, anger, fear, greed and the like, we should notice improvement in our behavior, thus lessening the backlash from our Actions (negative consequences) (*Karma* Account). Naturally, our mind would be at peace.”

“Mahatmaji, can you give me the essence of *Gita* in a few words ?” Gandhiji gave out a little chuckle and said, “Sure! Renounce your attachments and enjoy life!”

I thanked the Mahatma for giving this twenty minute discourse on *Karma Yoga* and bid him goodbye. It was now *Bhakta* Kanaka Dasa’s turn.

This man is sure he'll leave his stamp

Umesh Shenoy has two silvers and one bronze at Olympics

MUMBAI, AUGUST 10: Our best bet at the Olympics may just be a silver-haired gentleman from Dadar who is pushing 60 — but who has two silvers and a bronze from the past two Games. **UMESH V. SHENOY**, an assistant general manager with an insurance firm, is India's lone representative at Olympilex 2004, a show of Olympic coins, stamps and memorabilia during the Athens Games. The only non-sporting event at the Olympics, the Olympilex is the brainchild of former IOC president Juan Antonio Samaranch, himself a keen philatelist. The first Olympilex was held in Atlanta (1996) and included displays of Olympic coins and Olympic memorabilia. 63,000 visitors made it the most-frequented cultural exhibition then.

Shenoy had won a bronze medal at Atlanta, 1996 and two silvers at Sydney 2000.

His fascination with philately began when he was a 12-year-old. Bored spending lazy afternoons in his dad's cycle shop, he befriended the postman. "No one who came to our house left without being served tea", recalls Shenoy, amidst answering "all the best" calls hours before his departure. "So the postman would give me stamps as we waited for tea. I was fascinated by the colour schemes."

The fascination grew until, 14 years ago, Shenoy met an elderly Parsi gentleman. "He saw me poring through stamp catalogues; we started chatting and then he got angry when he found out I wasn't specialising in anything", says Shenoy. "At his insistence, I chose a specific subject in philately."

Being a sports enthusiast (he was a national *kho-kho* player), Shenoy drifted towards the Olympics. "Sourcing the stamps was difficult in the beginning", he says, but he was hooked. When his employers sent him to London, he even skipped lunch to hunt for stamp vendors.

Encouraged by friends, he held his first exhibition in 1992 at Nehru Centre, coinciding with the Barcelona Games. Many accolades later, he made it to the Atlanta Olympics in 1996. And returned with a bronze. "I was a different man after that", says Shenoy.

Sydney 2000 saw Shenoy exhibiting his book Olympics, A Philately Journey Through The Eras, and finished with silvers in the exhibition and literature categories.

Shenoy's taking it one notch higher this time: He has his stamps and two books — one on the history of the Winter Olympics and Total Football, a philatelic study of football.

Today, the stamps are worth Rs 15 lakh but Shenoy insists it's not just about the money: It's a passion.

And to illustrate why, he shows you a stamp issued by the Dominican Republic in 1956. "India has eight Olympic gold medals in hockey, yet the Dominican Republic issued a stamp that featured a Sardar playing hockey with the tricolour in the background. Amazing, isn't it?"
